Each month we like to spotlight one of the members of the Limelight Theatre community. This month, meet **Tim Riessen**, actor, musician and soon to be director!

Tim's first experience of working in theatre was while he was living in Albany, where he was fortunate to land a role in a production of *Jesus Christ Superstar*. He found this to be a wonderful experience and, caught by the bug, managed to land roles in two other productions. This fuelled a desire to do more, so Tim started looking for further acting opportunities when he moved to Perth.



In 2013, Tim came across audition an notice in local paper for Limelight Theatre's production The Phantom of the Opera. He was cast in a supporting role and hasn't looked back since! Since Phantom of the

Opera, Tim has performed in at least two shows a year at the Limelight, including *Pride and Prejudice, The Glorious Old Time Music Hall, Don't Shoot the Messenger and Blitz!*. His favourite role, however, was playing Eli Whitney in 2014's *Anything Goes*. 'He was a fun character to play,' says Tim. 'He was a bit of a caricature.' Tim also enjoyed the challenge of his role in 2015's *Speaking in Tongues*, where he played several characters in marital strife.

Tim's proudest theatrical moment, however, was when he was cast in his first leading role as Pa Larkin's in *The Darling Buds of May* in 2015. 'To carry this off and learn all the lines was definitely

an achievement'.

2017 brings about new and exciting challenges for Tim, who will be directing his first show – next month's *Let the Sunshine*. 'I wanted to direct because it seemed the next natural step,' he explains. 'Much as I'd like to have the lead role Jean Val-Jean in Les Mis, I'm probably past that. So if I want to put my stamp on a play and bring to life characters as I see them, then directing is the obvious path.'

And if he enjoys the experience? 'I would like to direct a musical next. I have thoroughly enjoyed the experience of musicals, the camaraderie, the teamwork, the working together to create something enjoyable for an audience. I want to have a go at bringing something like this to life!'

### Pygmalion (october season)

Professor of phonetics Henry Higgins makes a bet that he can train a bedraggled Cockney flower girl, Eliza Doolittle, to pass for a duchess at an ambassador's garden party by teaching her to assume a veneer of gentility, the most important element of which, he believes, is impeccable speech.

The play is a sharp lampoon of the rigid British class system of the day and a commentary on women's independence.

Eliza Doolittle (Late teens – Early 20's): Smart and sassy - must be able to perform both cockney and 'Received Pronunciation' English accents.

Professor Henry Higgins (Mid 30's - 40's): An English professor of phonetics. Impatient, but good at heart.

Colonel Hugh Pickering (Mid 30's - 40's): Also a phonetics expert, knowledgeable in foreign dialects and a true gentleman.

Alfred Doolittle (50's – 60's): Eliza's father. A scoundrel and cad - Welsh accent preferred

**Mrs. Higgins** (60's): Professor Higgins' mother, stern and forthright.


Mrs. Eynsford-Hill (60's): A lady of the upper-middle class who is in a rather impoverished condition but is still clinging to her gentility.

Clara Eynsford-Hill (Late teens - Early 20's): Her daughter; she tries to act the role of the modem, advanced young person.

Freddy Eynsford-Hill (20's – 30's): Her son; he is a pleasant young man who is enchanted by Eliza upon first meeting her.

**Mrs. Pearce** (30's – 50's): Professor Higgins' housekeeper of long standing. Very perceptive.

ROBBIE HART: B (below middle C) - Bb (above stave) - 20-35, extremely strong singer who can adapt to many different styles. Ability to play guitar a plus. Basic movement required.

JULIA SULLIVAN: G (below middle C) - D (top of stave) - 20-35, strong singer, Basic movement required. Strong acting ability.

**HOLLY:** A (below middle C) - E (top of stave) - 20-35, Julia's cousin. Must have strong dance ability, and a strong belty voice. Must be a strong actor. Comic timing a must.

**GEORGE:** Middle C - G (top of stave) - 25-30, Strong character singer who can rap and has good falsetto. Basic movement required. Plays Keyboard.

**SAMMY:** D (above middle C) - Gb (top of stave) - 20-35, Singer who can also play bass guitar. Basic movement required.

**GLEN GUGLIA:** D (above middle C) - Bb (above stave) - 25-40, Julia's fiancé, must have great acting skills with strong singing skills, and strong dance ability.

ROSIE: Middle C - C (middle of stave) - Robbie's Grandmother, 50+ we can age up if need be. Must have great comic timing and a singing voice that suits both classic musical theatre and rap. Basic movement required.

**LINDA:** A (below middle C) - D (top of stave) - 20 35, Robbie's girlfriend who leaves him at the altar. Strong belt voice with real grunt. Strong dance ability required.


